



2023 Basser Summer Scholars Internship

The Basser Center for BRCA at the Abramson Cancer Center, University of Pennsylvania, has established an eight-week Summer Scholars program to expand the pipeline of underrepresented candidates pursuing a career in genetic counseling, clinical genetics, and basic science related to cancer genetics. We are particularly interested in applicants from a racial/ethnic group that is underrepresented in medicine, from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, and/or who are the first generation in their family to attend college. The program is open to persons of all races and/or ethnicities. Students who are enrolled in an undergraduate program (through rising seniors) are eligible to apply. Interns will be paid \$23.44 per hour (subject to taxes). Interns are responsible for expenses such as housing and transportation. The goal of the program is to expand the pipeline and encourage students from underrepresented communities who are considering careers in genetic counseling, clinical genetics, and or related basic laboratory research in the field of cancer genetics will be considered for these positions. The internship will be held on the campus of the University of Pennsylvania, from June 12 to August 4, 2023, and will consist of exposure to research in the following areas related to cancer genetics:

- DNA damage repair basic science research
- Ovarian cancer research
- Clinically oriented cancer genetics and genomics research

There will be a one-week orientation component followed by a seven weeks in one of the laboratory/clinical research areas described above. Students will have the opportunity to meet with a diverse group of faculty and staff members to gain exposure to various career paths in basic science and clinical/translational medicine. The internship will culminate in a presentation by each intern on a topic of their choice.
